They shall speak of the glory of your reign, and declare your mighty deeds.

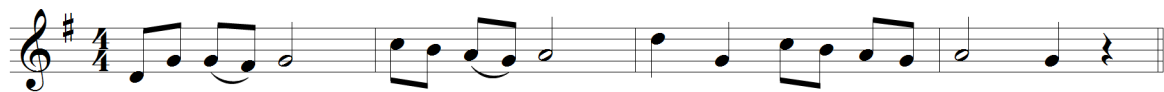

Within your house I'll find my peace, trusting that in your mercy you have sheltered me.

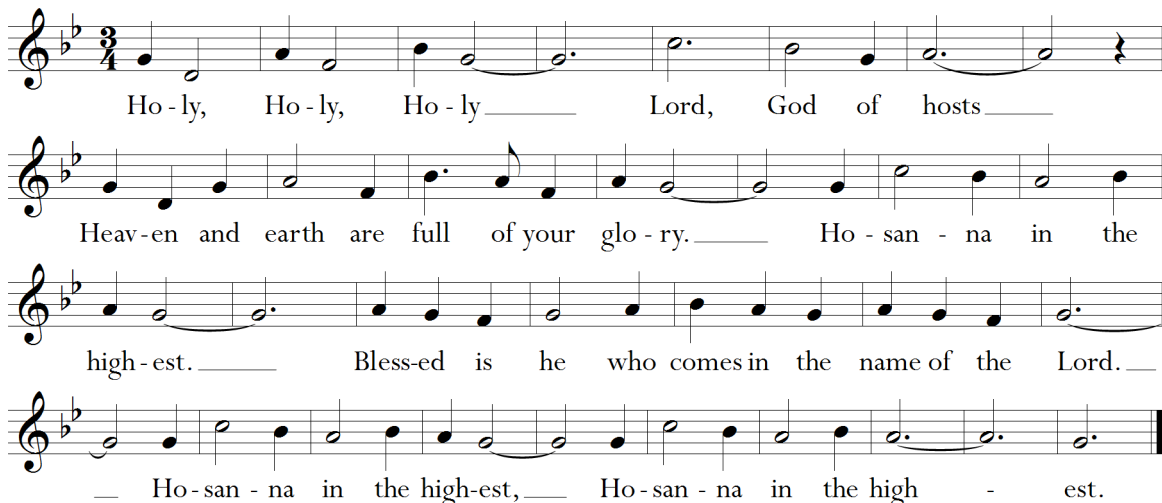
